What Does Yard Waste Consist of and the Requirements for Collection?

Yard Waste Definition (per Richland County Ordinance, Chapter 12): Any and all accumulations of grass, leaves, small trees, and branches (not exceeding four (4) inches in diameter), shrubs, vines and other similar items generated by the maintenance of lawns, shrubs, gardens and trees from residential property. Requirements for Collection: Limbs can be no larger than 4 feet long and 4 inches in diameter and no heavier than 40 pounds. Tree stumps of any size will not be collected. The amount of yard waste should not exceed an area of 4 feet wide, by 4 feet long and no higher than 4 feet tall. Larger piles may be picked up in portions. Place limbs in small piles for easy handling. All yard waste must be free from household garbage, litter or other non-yard waste material for collection service. Do not put yard debris in your roll cart. Debris from commercial tree cutters will not be picked up by the County.
